Research Interests

Stereotyping, prejudice, and discrimination

My research examines psychological processes related to stereotyping and prejudice, taking a dynamic approach that emphasizes multiple, competing influences and changes over time. I have conducted several studies examining the influence of factors such as individuating information, cultural values, threat, and ideology on stereotyping and prejudice. This work includes basic research on topics such as the effects of individuating information on stereotype activation and cultural influences on stereotype suppression, as well as in applied research on topics such as juror decision making, health judgments, and the experiences of communities that received large numbers of African American evacuees following Hurricane Katrina.

Behavior in legal contexts

My research investigates the psychological processes that underlie legally-relevant behaviors, such as juror decision making and eyewitness testimony. I have conducted a series of studies examining how jurors use character evidence in criminal trials. I also am interested in the ways that cultural values and other factors related to social group membership shape expectations about the justice system and influence behavior in legally-relevant contexts.

Expectancy-driven processing

Underlying much of my research is a theoretical interest in the influence of expectations and beliefs on judgments and behavior. My work examines a variety of expectations, including about expectations about social groups (i.e., stereotypes), societal institutions (e.g., the legal system), and health conditions (i.e., illness schemas).

Gender, race, and culture

Also central to my research is an interest in gender, race, and culture. I am interested in the influence of group membership on psychological and behavioral processes (e.g., how cultural background influences stereotype use), as well as the effects of group membership on the perception and treatment of individuals (e.g., race and gender discrimination).
